### FCSI® Leadership in Action

Volunteering is a rewarding and fun way for those in the business community to share their experiences with local students. FCSIs can volunteer for 1 of 2 in-class programs:

1. **Dollars with Sense (Grade 7):** helps young students understand the importance of planning for their financial futures. Topics include:
  - How to be a smart consumer
  - Differences among saving, spending and investing
  - Pros and cons of credit
  - Budgeting
  - Financial goal setting
2. **Economics for Success (Grade 8):** emphasizes the positive correlation between staying in school and achieving dreams. Topics include:
  - The world of work
  - Budgeting
  - Employability skills
  - Interviews
  - Goal setting
  - Career options and planning



### What is Junior Achievement?

Junior Achievement (JA) is the world's largest and fastest-growing non-profit education organization, now reaching 9.7 million students in 124 countries each year. For more than 40 years, Junior Achievement of Central Ontario (JACO) has provided a competitive advantage to the young people of our communities by offering in-school and after-school programs taught by trained volunteers.
